

#### Making the Case for Arts Education

#### **Student Outcomes - 21st Century Skills**

- Cognitive Skills creative thinking, critical thinking, problem solving and reasoning;
- Personal Outcomes engagement and persistence, motivation, positive behavior, self-efficacy and selfconfidence, self esteem
- Social and Civic Outcomes collaboration and communication
- Attendance



- 1 The arts teach children to make GOOD
  JUDGMENTS about qualitative relationships.
  Unlike much of the curriculum in which correct answers and rules prevail, in the arts, it is judgment rather than rules that prevail.
- The arts teach children that problems can have MORE than ONE solution and that questions can have more than one answer.
- The arts celebrate multiple **PERSPECTIVES**.

  One of their large lessons is that there are many ways to **SEE** and **INTERPRET** the world.
- The arts teach children that in complex forms of problem solving purposes are seldom fixed, but change with circumstance and opportunity.

  Learning in the arts requires the ABILITY and a WILLINGNESS to surrender to the unanticipated possibilities of the work as it unfolds.
- The arts make **VIVID** the fact that neither words in their literal form nor numbers exhaust what we can **KNOW**. The limits of our language do not define the limits of our **COGNITION**.

- The arts teach students that SMALL

  DIFFERENCES can have LARGE EFFECTS.

  The arts traffic in subtleties.
- 7 The arts teach students to think through and within a material. All art forms employ some means through which IMAGES become REAL.
- 8 The arts help CHILDREN LEARN to say what cannot be said. When children are invited to disclose what a work of art helps them FEEL, they must reach into their POETIC CAPACITIES to find the words that will do the job.








HS Students who took 4 YEARS of Arts & Music scored






#### Over the last 5 years, NBOE has seen:

- 18% increase in the number of Visual & Performing Arts Educators overall.
- 23% increase in the number of Music Educators.
- 34% increase in the number of Dance Educators
- Arts Ed Newark has leveraged the Victoria Foundation School Grants fund to impact 11,000+ Newark students and allocate nearly \$600,000 to arts education programs in Newark schools
- Arts Ed Newark has partnered with Save The Music to invest \$3.5M to impact 33
  Newark schools with their string and band instrument packages, professional
  development and other resources

#### 3. Meet with your local, state, or federal elected officials.


The most dependable way to communicate is to schedule a legislative visit. It may sound like an intimidating prospect but following these simple tips makes it easier than you think!
